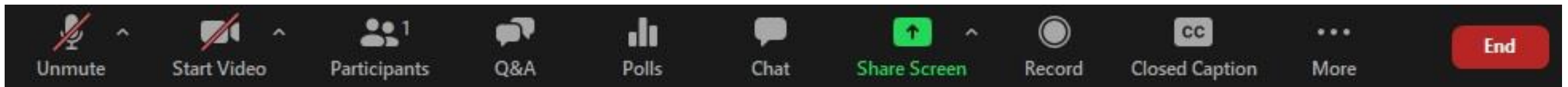

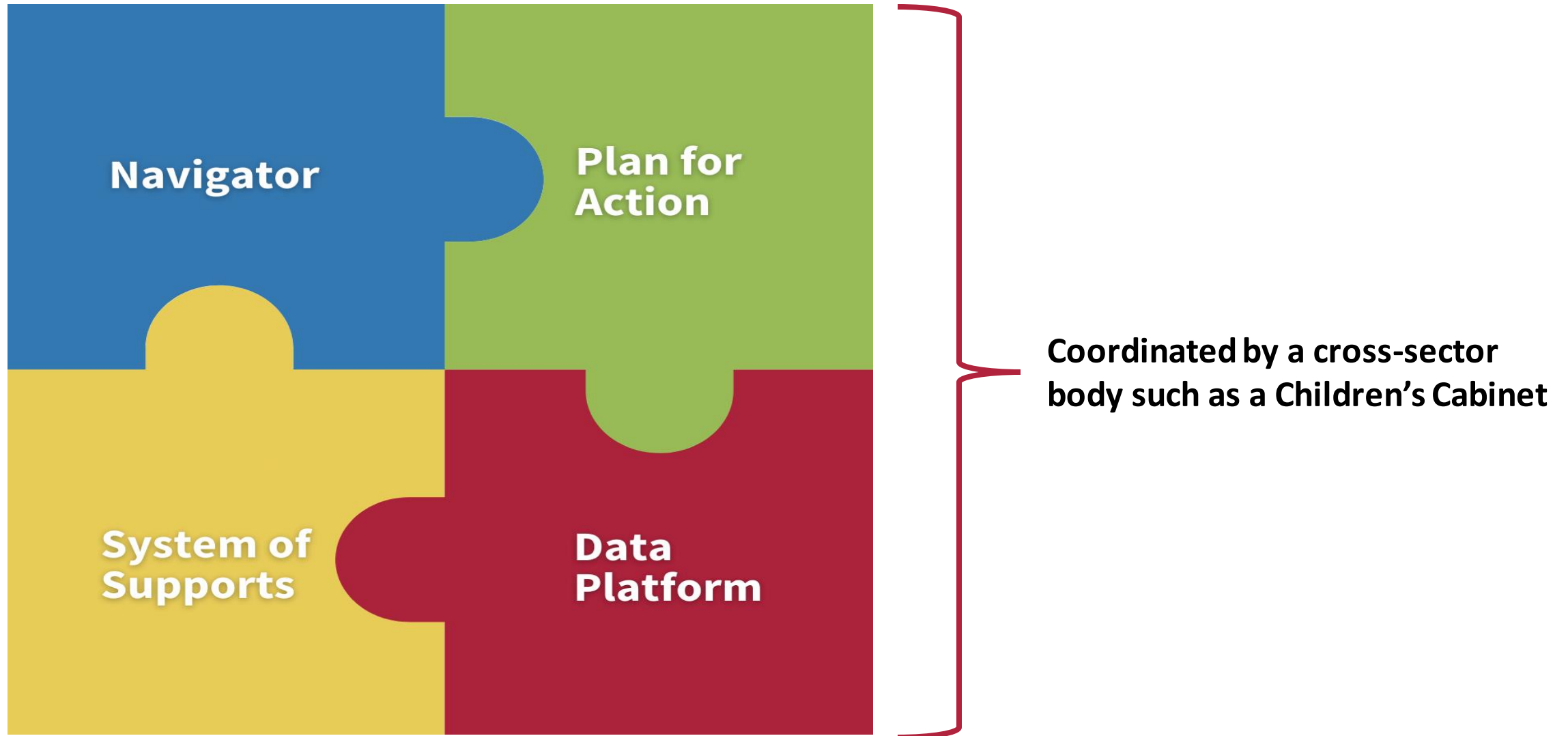

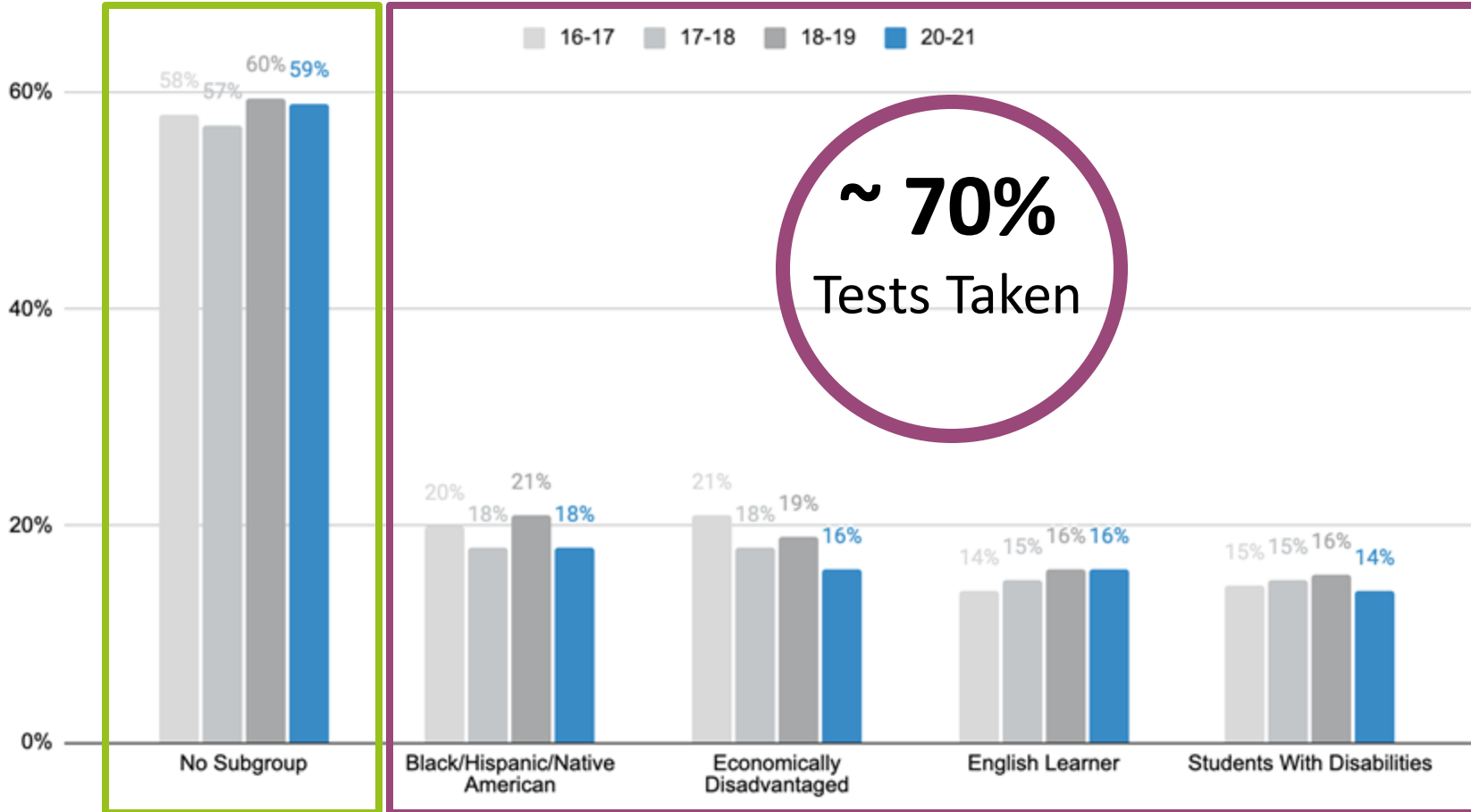

Schools in our historically underserved groups represent the largest share of our performance.

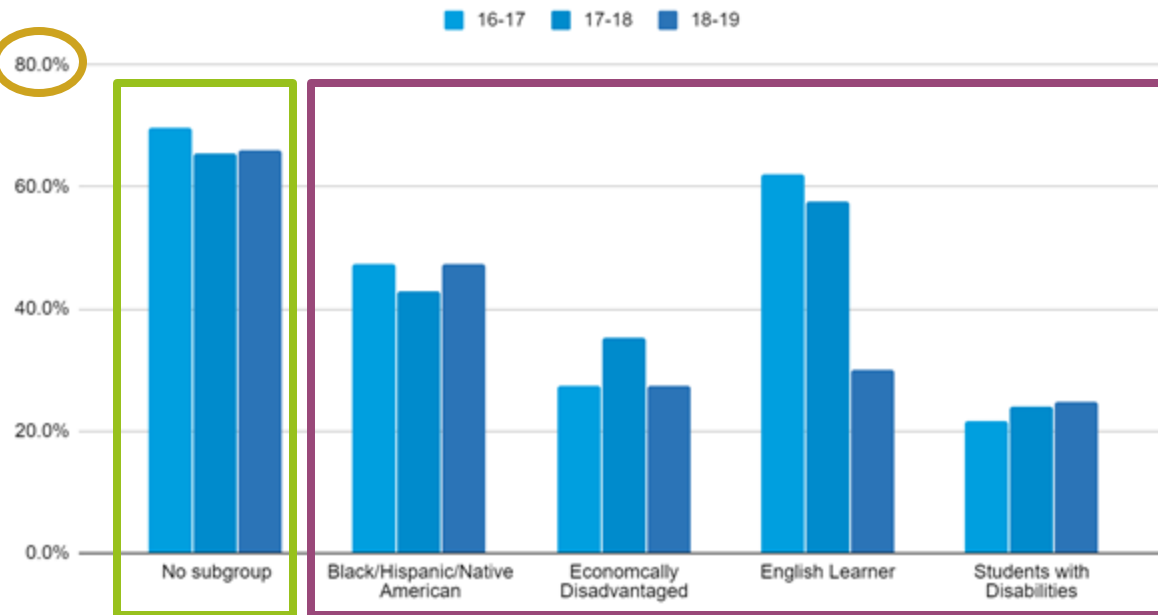
Our students who don't belong to an accountability group perform 3x better than their subgroup peers on state assessments in terms of proficiency rates.

The performance gaps persist even across schools with very different demographic make-up.

Students not in one of our historically underperforming subgroups are proficient at higher rates in both high and low performing schools. **The difference falls largely in the percentage of subgroup makeup across these schools.**

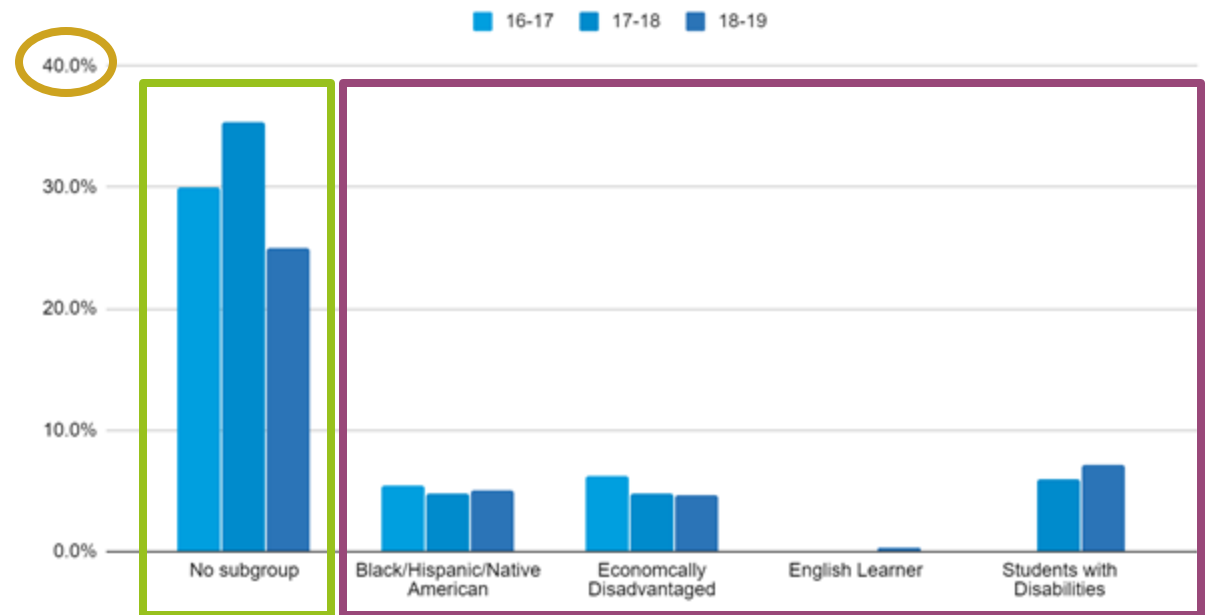

Student Success Planning is a comprehensive approach identify strengths, needs and interests of every student and use this information to develop an individualized plan for academic and non-academic success.

What are the key components of SSP?

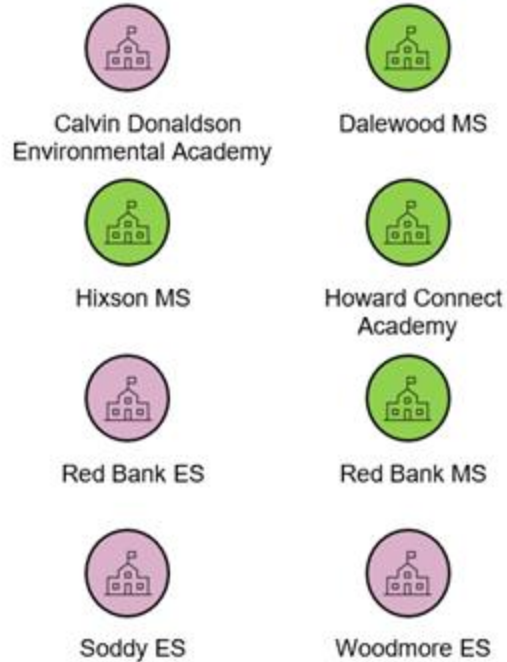
The Student Success Planning process continually **assesses** individual student strengths and needs, **connects** students to services, and **manages** service and support based on data. Each element of SSP is supported by a **broad range of stakeholders**

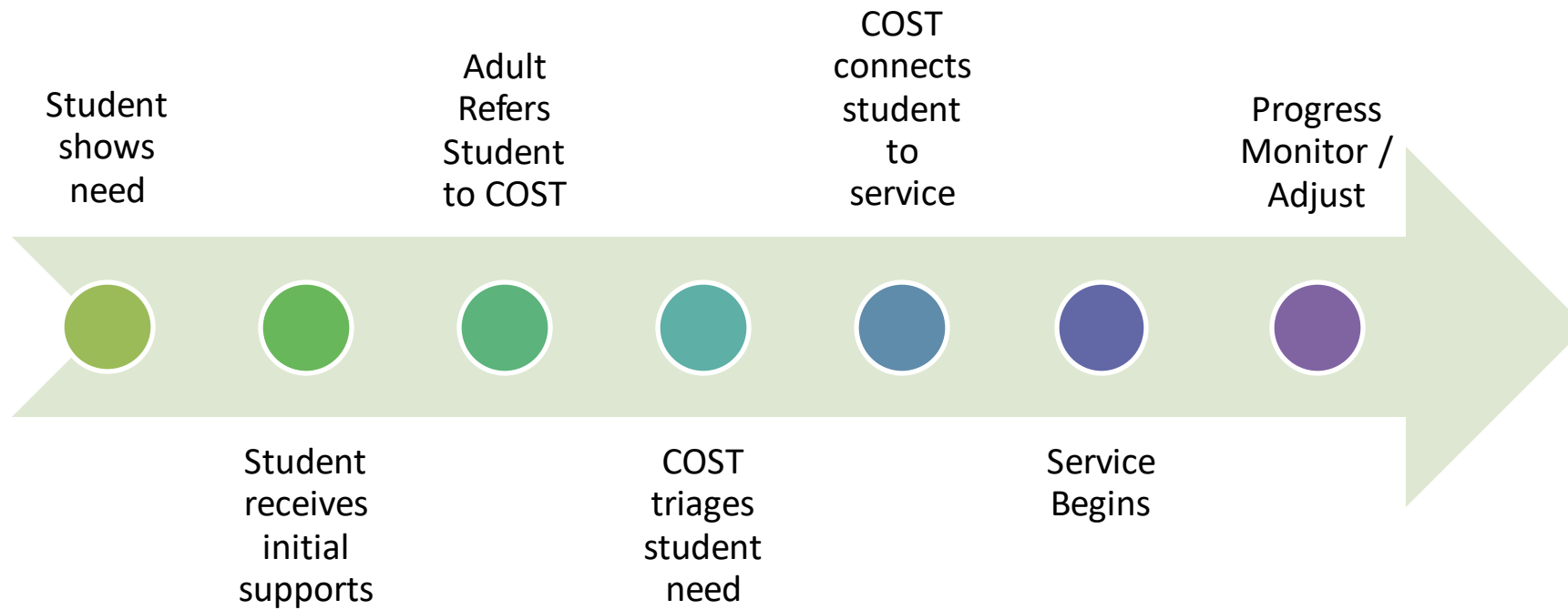
Coordination Of Services Team (COST)

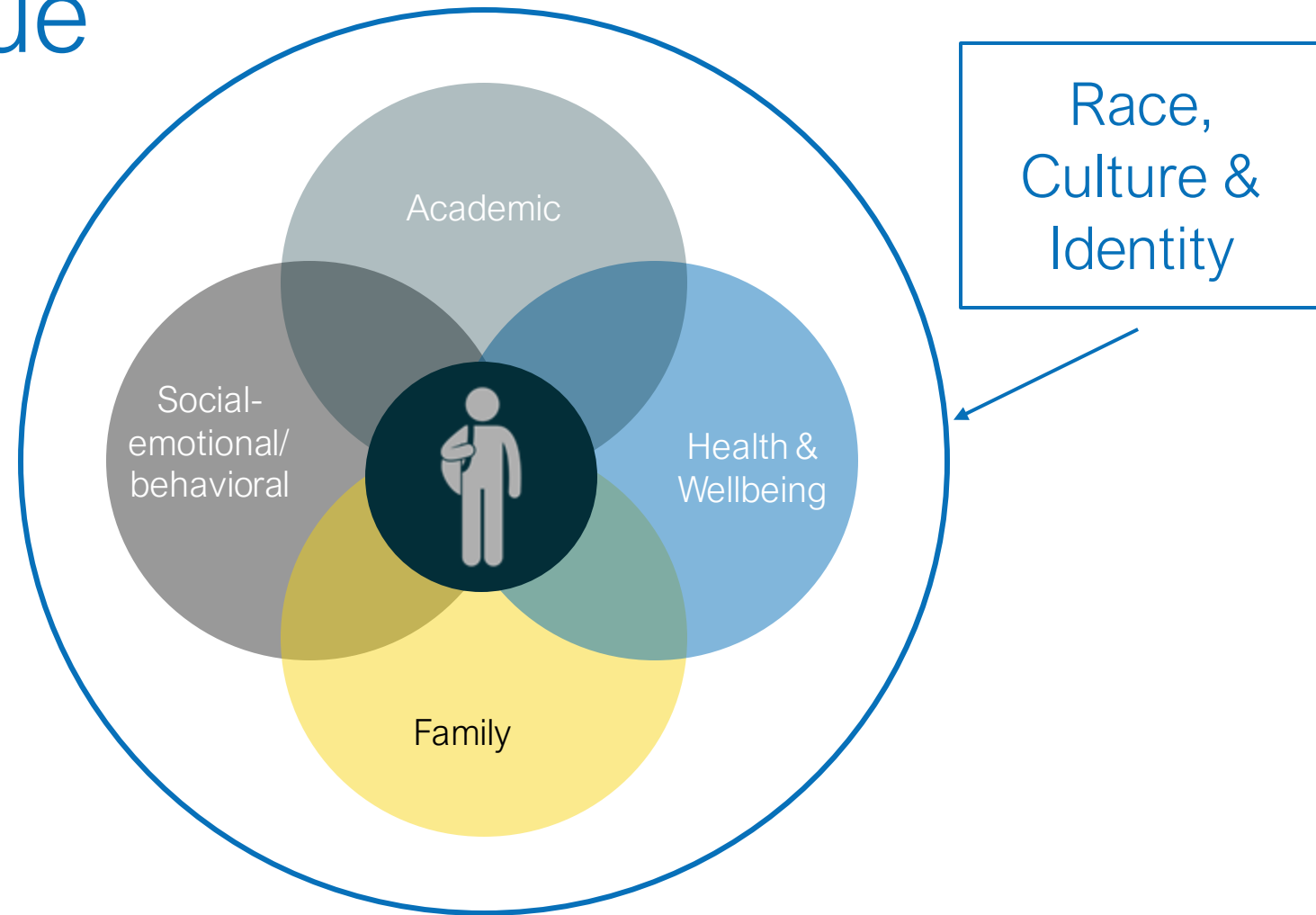

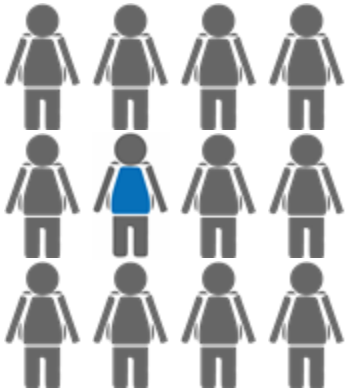

- Race, culture, history & identity cannot be detached from the whole child

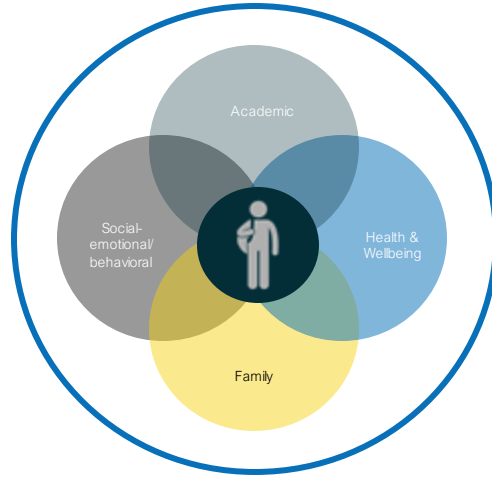
